
SDCTA meeting will be held the third Tuesday of this month so that our members can enjoy Valentines with their family and friends or their horse!!!

If your horse is like mine the stomach can get upset easily. I've started giving my mare 1/2 cup of apple cider vinegar (with the mother), twice a day. She has gotten used to it in her feed and now I don't have to disguise it with honey. You can read about the many benefits of apple cider vinegar for humans online. They call it mother's milk. It works!!!

Also instead of sugar I give tums or the cheaper Equate brand. I give these to her as she does her stretches before we ride. Less sticky, and the calcium helps with the stomach. She likes the peppermint kind, not crazy about the fruit ones. About 20 will do it!!

Horses are expensive enough and the more you can use items found in your cabinet that don't say equine or horses on the package, the cheaper it will be.
